General Studies Program May 10–June 7, 2019

Program Description

The program will be conducted in four weeks beginning in early-May at Zhengzhou University, Zhengzhou, China. The dates of the program are May 10 through June 7, 2019. The academic theme of this year's program is "Fostering Global Citizenry through Cultural Exploration."

This is a collaborative program co-sponsored by the Asia Council of the University System of Georgia (USG). The program's main host institution is Zhengzhou University (ZZU), a comprehensive educational institution with over 70,000 students and brand new campus facilities, in central China. Campus representatives of the Asia Council will serve as coordinators who will administer recruitment of faculty and students at their own institutions.

The main goal of this study is to help students — acquire a general grasp of the social, economic, and political systems of a different society and further a comparative worldview that can enhance—competence in their careers. Instruction will include class lectures, written projects, field trips, and weekend excursions. Eleven courses in the fields of communication, criminal justice, education, English, political science and sociology will be offered. An orientation session will be given to students on the first day of the class at the host university. Instructional formats specified above will meet the minimum number of class contact hours stipulated by the Board of Regents.

The program will begin with an educational tour of Beijing. On-site lectures and tours of famous cultural and historical sites will be given. While in Zhengzhou, a number of out-of-town short field trips to Luoyang, Dengfeng and Kaifeng will be offered. Students will be able to explore some of the impressive Chinese historical and cultural sites. Course-specific local field trips will be also arranged while in Zhengzhou. Each student is required to sign up for two courses. Short non-credit cultural enrichment courses will be offered based on students' interests.

Program Cost

Package cost is \$3,850 for the four-week program. The cost includes the following items:

- Round trip airfare between Atlanta and China
- Local transportation for all group activities, including airport pickup, high-speed train, bus, and other means of transportation if needed
- Accommodations in the host cities
- Most meals on campus and during group tours
- Group excursions

- Admission to museums and attractions.
- The use of classrooms and facilities at host institutions
- Group emergency medical and accidental insurance

The package cost does not include tuition, textbooks, passport and visa expenses, spending money, ground transportation to and from the Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport, or other costs beyond those listed above.

Tuition will be assessed at the institution where the student registers. Students should plan to budget a minimum of \$600–\$700 for extra meals, shopping, taxi, and evening entertainment. If a student has an extended travel plan or making large purchases, additional funds should be budgeted. Western Union offers a convenient way to wire funds from the U.S. to major Chinese cities. Some course excursions might involve additional fees, but course instructors will inform students at the time of orientation if such fees apply.

Cities To Be Visited

Beijing -China's capital city. We will visit the Great Wall, the Forbidden City, Summer Palace, and much more.

Xi'an-Ancient capital city. We will visit First Emperor's burial ground and Terra Cotta Warriors' Museum.

Zhengzhou-Capital city of Henan province, and our host Zhengzhou University is located here.

Luoyang -Ancient capital. We will visit Longmen Grot-

Shanghai 'The showcase of modern China. We will visit the Yu Garden and watch an acrobatic show. Students will have time to do some last-minute shopping.





Program Admission

The program has a limit of thirty-five students. Any fulltime or part-time student is eligible to participate in the program. Students from institutions that are not part of



the USG are admitted on a spaceavailable basis and must enroll as transient students at a participating institution.

Students from participating USG institutions will register their courses at their home institution. For students from a USG institution that has no faculty participation or a non-USG institution, students must register as a transient student at Dalton State College.

An application package must be submitted before or on **February 8, 2019** to the participating faculty members on your campus, or if there is no faculty participant, to the program Director Dr. Baogang Guo, Department of Social Sciences, Dalton State College, 650 College Drive, Dalton, GA, 30720. Students who apply before or on **December 15, 2018** will receive a \$50 "early-bird discount."

The program offers a number of program assistant positions to participating students who have good academic standing, leadership skills and international tavel experience. Student assistants will get \$500 program fee reduction.
