



The East-West Center Graduate Degree Fellowship

The East-West Center is a leader in educating people of the Asia Pacific region to meet the evolving demands and interdependency of global change. The Center offers scholarships for Master's and PhD study at the University of Hawaii for students with an interest in the Asia Pacific region. These studies are enhanced by a unique program of cultural, social and professional development at the East-West Center where students from across the Asia Pacific region and the United States learn, work, and live together. Through cultural exchange, civic engagement, education on regional issues, and leadership opportunities, the East-West Center experience helps students develop the skills needed for 21st century action and build lasting relationships and a network of people committed to positive change.

Graduate Degree Fellowship

The Graduate Degree Fellowship provides funding for graduate students with a commitment to the Asia Pacific region to pursue a graduate degree at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa and participate in residential, educational, and leadership development programs at the EWC. Studies can be in any field as long as there is a connection to the Asia Pacific. Recent students have studied such diverse fields as political science, linguistics, urban and regional planning, natural resource management, Asian studies, anthropology, tropical medicine, musicology, theater and physics.

Funding

The fellowship provides up to two years of scholarship funding that covers tuition and fees, residence hall room costs, health insurance subsidy, book allowance, and a partial living stipend. Fellows are also eligible to apply for supplemental field study and travel grant awards.

Eligibility

Citizens or permanent residents of the United States or countries in the Pacific and Asia. Must be eligible for graduate degree study at the University of Hawaii.
