Admissions

- We require an appropriate academic background (Bachelor's or Master's) in psychology, business, or another discipline related to organizational behavior and human resource management. Other academic backgrounds may be considered. A competitive score on either the GMAT or GRE is required. The expectation is that individuals seeking admission to the program wish to pursue careers in research and teaching in academic schools of business.
- The Department of Management accepts a new Ph.D. cohort each fall semester. All materials must be submitted by January 2018 for full consideration to enter the 2018/2019 cohort.
- Required application materials include:
 An online application, official transcript, three letters of reference, resume or CV, letter of intent, and valid GMAT or GRE scores.
